Why do we have Pupil Leaders?

Nurturing effective and confident pupil leaders is an important element of our school's success. Pupils are encouraged to develop the necessary skills to enable them to take responsibility for their school and to contribute positively towards the school and wider community.

What do Pupil Leaders do?

Our leaders can be responsible for helping supervise younger students at lunch and break times, they also support our staff with various duties around the school. All our leaders receive special training and through their duties develop their own assertiveness, punctuality and become responsible members of the school community. All Year 6 pupils have the opportunity to apply for a leadership position, provided that they demonstrate excellent behaviour in school and act as role models for younger children. Pupils apply for the positions to support our democratic and fair process.

Core Pupil Leadership responsibilities:

- To act as a role model for pupils and promote the ethos and values of St Vincent's
- To continue to maintain the high standards expected of a St Vincent's pupil
- To perform one break time or other duty a week
- To attend school events when required
- To attend all meetings as required
